"In 1943, the American Legion initiated action that would benefit the veterans of World War II. Nicknamed the "GI Bill of Rights," this bill was drafted by American Legion rehabilitation experts. The Auxiliary began an all-out campaign for the bill, taking the message into cities and towns across America. The effort resulted in the passage of the "Servicemen's Readjustment of 1944" through both Houses of Congress without a dissenting vote."

The American Legion Family has led the nation in helping our veterans and their families throughout its history. Many of these facts are highlighted in the American Legion Auxiliary's Leadership Correspondence Course. The Course is now available in a power point version. There is also a version for the Juniors. We are focusing on the following this year:

Homeless Veterans: Do you realize that many of our veterans sleep on the streets, parks, wooded areas? They do not use the VA services nor even aware of them. They become homeless - rising unemployment, costs of living, physical and mental health issues, addiction, and our veterans return with PTSD and TBI are just some of the conditions they come home with. Some don't remember being married or having children. Let's do everything we can to be of service to our homeless veterans. "Stand Downs" are part of the VA&R, providing services to homeless veterans. These stand downs last 1 to 3 days providing services to the homeless veterans such as food, shelter, clothing, health screenings, haircuts, VA and Social Security benefits, housing, and more. <u>POINTS OF INTEREST FOR THE UNIT</u>

Department Obligations are Veterans Facility Funds, Blanket Fidelity Bond, ALA Communiqué subscriptions, Per Capita and Veterans Assistant Fund. These obligations are on a form which is in the packets obtained at School of Instruction for the individual Units. These forms have been calculated for each Unit using the membership of the previous year at the close of the Department books. Deadline is October 20, 2012. PLEASE REMEMBER IT IS JUST LIKE RECEIVING A BILL; IT IS PAYABLE WHEN DUE. Units do not need to vote on these obligations. The Unit Treasurer should send a check to Department upon receiving the Unit Obligation Form.

Definitions: Veterans Facility Fund – Formally the Christmas Gift Shop; Blanket Fidelity Bond – Employee dishonest insurance is bought through an individual (which in this case means the Unit is the individual); *ALA Communiqué* – This is the communication between the Department and the Unit. It is located in the middle of the Legionnaire. This is per senior members only; Veterans Assistance Fund – Purchase of items used at the VA facilities such as combs etc.; **Per Capita** – It is the same as saying **per** member (A Unit should have two accounts-General Fund and the Welfare Fund. The per capita can be taken from both of these accounts. The obligation is \$.60 so from the General Fund Account you may take \$.45 per member and from the Welfare Fund Account the amount of \$.15 per member. If a Unit wishes the entire \$.60 per member may be taken from the General Fund Account.)

VA centers, call one in Des Moines, Iowa City, Omaha or Sioux Falls. They would love to have you. Don't forget the Iowa Veteran's Home in Marshalltown. We need to do what we do best and that is **VOLUNTEERING.**

Adopting a Veteran: Why not adopt a veteran in the hospital, nursing home, or even at your own Post. Many veterans have no one to visit them. Make a huge difference in their lives by remembering them on special occasions and let them know just how much we appreciate their service to our country. Bring our Juniors along-that always brings a smile.

Creative Arts: VA facilities nationwide use creative arts as rehabilitative treatments to help veterans cope and recover from physical and emotional disabilities. There are 120 categories to compete in. Keep this program alive by donating towards this wonderful project. They go on to compete in National competition.

Continue to have welcome home celebrations. Let our veterans know we are glad they are home safely. Provide volunteer assistance and donations to this wonderful project and to Fisher House.
