Stop by the membership table at Mid-Winter and we'll have some fun


It was great to see everyone at District Meetings this fall. The

As Iowa culminates the "year of the veteran" you could include such activities as pocket flag folding for the deployed military, writing and welcoming home veterans on honor flights, donating flags, supporting & maintaining your county's freedom rock, quilts of valor, assisting veterans in community schools, float and parade participation, partnering with the Legion Family Americanism project opportunities and teaming-up with the Iowa High School Student Council 2015-2016 service projects, and any other Americanism-type of activity as we "Honor Our Veterans ~ Past. Present and Future"

As a Unit of the American Legion Auxiliary you have access to masses of information on helping our Veterans, our Active Duty Military and the Children of these same individuals. Community Service allows you to involve your community in these efforts and to give your Unit attention through your involvement in your community.

What community service projects have you been working on this year? Are you using the Community Service Hours Worksheet that is available at the www.ialegion.org/ala web page to keep track of the projects, the hours, the dollars, the volunteers? Has your local Auxiliary Unit partnered with non- Auxiliary members of your community for a combined event? Have you gotten your communities citizens involved in your support Veterans programs? Let's hear about them on the Annual Reports due April 30th

While I have yet to find a listing of all things that qualify as Community Service here are a few: Serving your communities governing offices, as an elected official or appointed representative; working on community projects: church activities ie: teaching Sunday school, singing in the choir, planning activities; preparing welcome baskets for new members of your community; gift baskets for holidays; taking part in community support committees; remembering families of deployed and active duty military; scooping the sidewalk of an elderly citizen; serving and working at funerals both community members and veterans. Yes, Veterans funeral workers and food donations are community service. Things you can do are: organize a community safety fair; inform you community of the help available in a disaster; inform you community of the services provided through your Fire Department, the Red Cross, and any other organization that helps the citizens in your community. Support and assist with Meals on Wheels, Get Out the Vote, Travel to Doctor appointments. The list can go on and on. When possible publicize your activity, let your community know what you do for them.

Just remember to wear your Auxiliary shirt or pin, write all this down so that our organization gets the credit and report it all on your Annual Report. If you have a special project or just do great work throughout the year. Send me a narrative report, pictures, newspaper articles. Let the rest of the country know what you are doing.
