### Cancellation of Unit Charter

Many questions have been asked on how to cancel a Unit Charter. In other words Disband a Unit.

1. **NO** Charter should be considered for cancellation or disbanding without the Unit first involving and working with the County/District/Department Membership Team. The Post should also be notified.

2. If the Unit cannot be saved, encourage members to transfer to another Unit before the Unit cancels the Charter.

3. After all means to save the Unit has been exhausted the following procedures **MUST** be followed: A) A Unit wanting to relinquish their Charter for cancellation **MUST** send an advance written notice to their entire membership and shall indicate a vote will be taken at a regular meeting of the Unit as to whether or not to cancel the Charter (disband). Only those members in attendance may vote. Absentee votes will not be counted; B) Notification **MUST** be given to the Department Headquarters and the Unit Charter Cancellation will then be voted on by the Department Executive Committee and then forwarded to the National Headquarters for vote by the National Executive Committee; and, C) When a Unit ceases to function or its Charter has been revoked or cancelled, **the Charter and ALL FUNDS must be forward immediately to Department Headquarters.** The Department Office does not have room for other records.

The main goal is to support Units and avoid the cancellation of Charters. However, there are times when cancellation is unavoidable or may be just the best thing for a Unit. Good judgment and common sense should prevail as to how best to proceed with the decision.

### Cancellation of County Charter

*If a County chooses to disband they must follow all of the above requirements except for notifying all members of the County. Instead all Units in the County must be notified. If a County disbands the Units in that County do not have to disband. However, if a County has active Units, disbanding is not encouraged.*

## 2014 VAMC and IVH Tours

The VA&R Team along with Commander Ron, President Diana and many others toured Des Moines, Iowa City, Omaha, and Sioux Falls VA Health Care Facilities and the Iowa Veterans Home in September and October of 2014. We saw many renovations and constructions in progress.

They are also keeping up with the latest advances in medicine. Tele-Health connects all the facilities with the CBOCs (Community Based Outpatient Clinics) and also with Minneapolis letting doctors check out patients via cameras.

Mental Health and space issues are areas of most concern for the facilities at this time. We were impressed at how well the Iowa City VAMC works together with the UIHC on areas of staffing and research.

The Des Moines VAMC is working on renovating in-patient rooms to private with bath/shower features as well as Horcher Medical Systems lifts in the rooms.

The Sioux Falls VAMC has Community Living Centers on two floors as well as a Homeless Team which assists with housing and health issues.

The Omaha VAMC has several Access specialty clinics with a very good mental health facility shared with Creighton.

At the Iowa Veterans Home (IVH), there are four medical doctors on a 24-7 care basis with two Nurse Practitioners. They also contract with five other specialty doctors.

Each facility has special needs: Iowa City needs lap robes, IVH needs monetary donations to purchase holiday gifts for residents, and they all need new winter coats and clothing. The full needs lists are on the ALA website.

Be sure to send your donations to the Department Office earmarked with the facility's name. Then send a postcard to the facility telling them the amount of your donation and what it is for. Remember that many of these veterans are alone and would simply like a card or letter from someone who cares. Or even better how about a visit. We found our VA Health Care Facilities standing ready to meet the needs of all our veterans every day.

## American Legion Auxiliary Girls State

The dates for the 2015 session of Iowa American Legion Auxiliary Girls State are June 14 through 19, again at the ISU campus in Ames. Girls are expected to arrive for registration, unpacking, AND lunch between 10:AM and Noon, because we begin promptly at 1:PM with our first session. In order to begin on time, many of the cities begin walking over to the meeting from the dorms before 12:45, and some girls need to change into picture clothing after they arrive, so they should plan for plenty of extra time in their arrival schedule.

Reservation deadline is December 1st to have your money at the Department Office. You may reserve space for more than one citizen, but spaces after the first citizen are filled on a first come, first serve (first paid!) basis. The fee is \$400 for the combined t-shirt, registration fees (which include all take-home items such as photos, name badge, manual, pin, etc.), and Girls State fee is payable to the Department Office.

Shortly after the first of the new year, your Unit will receive a postcard or e-mail with the website and code for your Girls State citizen to register online. Please be sure that the GIRLS STATE CITIZEN is the one doing this registration! Last year, we had many incomplete registrations because someone other than the actual citizen was completing this information (guidance counselor, Unit officers, etc.). There is health information, permissions, and other personal information that should be entered by the citizens themselves (or their parent or guardian), which is required by our facility and our nurse. This process needs to be completed by February 28, 2015.

Continue to stay in contact with your Girls State citizen throughout the spring. Touch base with her to make sure she is completing this online "paperwork." and see if she has questions for you. If you can't answer them, you know at least two people who might be able to help you. (Mary & Michele!) Try to help her connect with previous years' Girls state citizens, especially if those girls were excited about their experience.

The website will be updated on or around the first of the year as well. Look for an updated packing list, as requested by last year's Girls State citizens.

This year's wish list includes the usual Wal-Mart and Hy-gee gift cards to help defray expenses when we arrive in Ames for supplies. We also need campaign paper this year – a few years ago, we asked for that, and have finally depleted that supply. We would like mostly lighter colors and letter, legal, or 11x17 size paper.

We are also asking for monetary assistance for specific aspects of the program. Costs are rising (at least 1% per year for facility costs), and the fees we charge are not always meeting the rate of increase. Consider a sponsoring a donation of some sort, if you or your Unit is able – such as "today's city meeting is sponsored by Unit 47 of Fairfield." Here are some of the individual costs for Girls State: one manual = \$7; one night's stay in the dorm (per person) = \$28; Governor's Gavel = \$23; Breakfast (per person, per day) = \$7.50; Lunch/Dinner (per person, per day) = \$10; City Hall room rent, per day = \$250; Large Room Rental, per day = \$650. Donations may be sent to the Department Office with "Girls State Donation" in the memo line. Gift cards are to be sent to the Department Office where they will be recorded and given to Mary Andersen for needed purchases.

Girls State will again be holding a silent auction on Saturday evening at Mid-Winter Conference, so be sure to bring items for that event, and your pocketbook, so you can bid, bid, bid!

Thank you for your support of the Girls State program, for this appointment, and for the opportunity to continue to serve the American Legion Auxiliary in this capacity.
